Native and Protected Reptile Species Regulations



Common Native Species

Frogs:

- American Toad, Anaxyrus americanus Boreal Chorus Frog, Pseudacris maculata Bullfrog, Lithobates catesbeianus Cope's Gray Treefrog, Hyla chrysoscelis

Sales and Possession Limits for Native Species:

It is not legal to <u>sell</u> native amphibian and reptile species (whether threatened, endangered, special concern, or common) in Wisconsin, regardless of their origin (in-state or out-of-state collection, captive breeding, etc.).

The only exception for \underline{sales} involves color variants of these native herptile species that have been bred in captivity and have coloration that is clearly distinct from the wild-type morphological color patterns.

- A person may collect or possess up to 5 individuals of each native herptile species that are not protected, with the following exceptions:

 The possession limit for both snapping turtles (Chelydra serpentina) and softshell turtles (Apalone sp.) is 3 statewide.

 Up to 2 milksnakes (Lampropeltis triangulum) and 2 foxsnakes (Pantherophis vulpinus) may be collected or possessed.

 Up to 2 gray rat snakes (Pantherophis spiloides), 2 gophersnakes (Pituophis catenifer), and 2 North American (blue) racers (Coluber constrictor) may be possessed, but ONLY IF legally obtained and originating from out of state.

 There are no possession limits for herptiles not listed as Endangered and Threatened that are atypically colored or atypically patterned (e.g. albinos, striped snakes that are typically blotched).

Special Concern & Protected Species

Endangered

- Blanchard's Cricket Frog, Acris blanchardi Slender Glass Lizard, Ophisaurus attenuatus Eastern Massasauga, Sistrurus catenatus
- Eastern Ribbonsnake, Thamnophis sauritus
- Queensnake, *Regina septemvittata* Western Ribbonsnake, *Thamnophis proximus*
- Ornate box turtle, Terrapene ornata

Threatened

- Butler's Garter Snake, Thamnophis butleri
- Blanding's Turtle, *Emydoidea blandingii* Wood Turtle, *Clemmys insculpta*

Other

- Gray Ratsnake, Pantherophis spiloides
- Gophersnake, Pituophis catenifer North American (Blue) Racer, Coluber constrictor
- Timber Rattlesnake, Crotalus horridus

Permit Restrictions

Permits are issued only for select education, research, and conservation activities.

Endangered and Threatened species (including all parts and all life stages) may <u>NOT</u> be collected from the wild (dead or alive), possessed, or even touched, without first having a valid Endangered and Threatened Species Permit. Select **Other** reptiles listed also may not be collected from the wild in Wisconsin.
